Meet the Cincinnati Chamber's next WE Lead class

The Cincinnati USA Regional Chamber has selected 54 women representing 51 different companies to participate in its 13th WE Lead class.

The leadership development arm of the Chamber's Women Excel program provides training for women in mid- to upper-level management, female business owners and other top female leaders. During the 10-month program, participants will take part in professional coaching, practical learning experiences, mentoring, and support and growth opportunities.

WE Lead was created in 2005 by Myrita Craig, the former vice president of Small Business and Programs at the Chamber, in response to a study by the Women's Fund of the Greater Cincinnati Foundation. Since then, more than 600 women have graduated from WE Lead, including the Chamber's CEO, Jill Meyer.

This year's participants will attend a kickoff event 5-7 p.m. Sept. 5 at the chamber's Fourth Street office.
